In-Depth Training for Wound Care Nurses

Seminar Purpose

OBRA F-314 requirements, introduced in 2005, for pressure ulcers require accurate risk assessment of the resident, specifically measured wound assessment, wound classification, wound treatment, and detailed documentation.

Over the past two years, surveyors have specifically targeted wound care. The facility treatment nurses are the directors of this important care issue and often the ones suggesting the appropriate plan of care to facility physicians. Treatment nurses MUST be adequately trained in the above techniques in order to be successful.

Previous wound care seminars have covered the revised rules, regulations and proper protocol to follow for compliance with F-314. The Council previously conducted an all-day, in-depth seminar for nurses to learn the skills and procedures needed to be successful in the job of treatment nurse. Due to member request, the Council is repeating this important seminar.

This all day seminar will not only cover how to accurately assess the resident and the wound, but will cover topical wound therapy, dressings, infection control, and a review of the regulations. In addition to a detailed and measured assessment of the resident and the wound, treatment nurses must know which treatment and dressing classification is appropriate for proper healing. Nurses attending this seminar will come away prepared to meet the challenges of wound therapy.

The speakers for this seminar will be **Carol L. Walters**, MSN, RN, COCN, CWCN, independent wound care consultant, and **Susan Duda Gardiner**, BSN, RN, the Council's Director of Clinical Services. This seminar is relevant for DONs, ADONs, wound care treatment nurses, and those responsible for assessment and treatment of wounds, as well as administrators who should know what a wound care protocol must contain.
